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Difference between Sports and Hobbies

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Abstract

Purpose: The purpose of this research was to produce a work that will resolve the problem of neglecting the importance of sports and hobbies vocabulary in our national educational system in South Sudan. It will also work as a catalase of change in the Southern Sudanese system of academic development.

Methodology: A desktop literature review was used for this purpose. The study's relevant seminal references and journal articles were identified using Google Scholar and other database engines.

Findings: The findings revealed that the main problem in learning English in South Sudan is the curriculum's lack of English vocabulary related to Sports and Hobbies. And this results negatively in a flawed educational system in which school leavers are graduated from their schools with little knowledge, if not ignorant, because sports and hobbies knowledge is totally or entirely ignored in setting our curriculum.

Unique Contribution to Theory, Policy, and Practice: The new idea in this study is to give importance to vocabulary related to sports and hobbies as the shortest way to help learners and indicate the necessity of sports and hobbies to be part of our culture and to pave the road for their existence as part of our national phenomenon. Besides, it will significantly contribute to the actual knowledge of the academic community's current understanding of their subject. Moreover, this research will challenge other research on learning English as a Foreign Language in South Sudan because it looks deeply at the root of this problem. This poorly planned educational system never gives room for new ideas to develop. Besides, this proposal will also provide a solution for ignoring sports and hobbies vocabularies in our educational system and will help inject English vocabulary into our curriculum development. Being the first in South Sudan, this research will significantly help teachers, students, the Ministry of Education, at home, and whoever wants to learn vocabulary related to sports and hobbies. It will also be helpful and reachable for many people learning English as a foreign language. It will also help provide English vocabulary related to sports and hobbies through research in our educational system.

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Introduction

This writing aimed to encourage and help learners learn the difference between sports and hobbies activities and their related vocabularies and action words for different sports and hobbies in English. However, I consider it as one of the ways to inject English vocabulary related to sports and hobbies into our educational system and school syllabus in this country (Young, 2018). Moreover, this step will encourage and promote learning English vocabulary in its easiest method since it exists in the national curriculum of South Sudan, daily life, and surroundings since English is spoken as a second language and used as an official language in the country. Many kinds of research have been done about South Sudan in different fields. Still, they ignore the importance of sports and hobbies vocabulary in learning English as a second or foreign language in our educational system. Many school leavers finish their general education without knowing anything about our sports and hobbies terms in English (Clark, 2019). In addition, many of them feel tongue-tied and have no reasoning or power when the issue is related to sports and hobbies. To underscore this, many learners of English as a foreign language in South Sudan, including our elites, face challenges when the topic is connected to sports and hobbies. They prefer colloquial Juba Arabic (dialect) or Arabic Language rather than English vocabulary in South Sudan.

However, in a young country like South Sudan, there is a thin line to differentiate between these two activities because they are not culturally rooted in this country. Hence, the only well-known examples of sport and hobby here are wrestling and knitting, respectively. Nevertheless, in a country where English is spoken as a native language, like England, sports and hobbies activities are well-known games for passing the time. The learners should learn to talk and communicate with English speakers about these activities (Bozon, 2013). Therefore, it is necessary for South Sudanese learners who learn English as a foreign language to be able to know and discuss the different types of sports and hobbies activities. The learning will help them communicate with English speakers at home or in their countries. Knowing sports, hobbies, and vocabulary will also benefit them in the workplace, primarily when they work in an industry producing or selling sports materials and being helpful at school when taking part in physical education (Hiltscher, 2021).
